Sreelakam Lifelong Learning Institute, Cherpu Bhagavathy Temple West Nada, Cherpu -680561 is not a hotel. We have no security at gate and we are not open 24 hours a day. It will be difficult if you arrive after 8:00 PM on Friday, March 21, 2025 to direct you to your assigned room.

Please bring your own bath towels, soap and other personal items. Please do not dispose paper products in the toilets.

There are no individual lockers.

Hot water is limited to 8 rooms only in the East wing at the middle of the wing, near the coldwater drinking facility. The bathrooms for people who needs help have hot water in all the 4 floors and may be used by others who need hot water. These bathrooms are near the drinking water facility in all the 4 floors.

Most of you will be housed in the West wing, 1st floor hall for ladies and 2nd floor hall for men. These halls are 24.6 meters x 6.1 meters that can accommodate 100 beds each in both. In all the floors there are bath rooms at the South end. The East-South end bath rooms in each floor are for Men and West-South end bathrooms for women. In each bath room we have 9 toilets and 2 showers (cold water only). There is also water facility inside the sleeping halls.

There are 22 toilets available in each floor for a total of 88 toilets. There is one bathroom outside the building near the electric generator.

There are a total of 28 showers available.

We have bed sheets available. But we encourage and request our guests to bring their own.

Only vegetarian food will be served.

Please conserve water. Do not let water run when not in use.

No smoking and drinking inside the building as well as the compound.

We try our best to follow green protocol.

Please leave your footwear outside. If you want to use footwear inside the building, please bring another set. Please consider Sreelakam as your own house and try to keep it as clean as possible. Limited volunteers try their best, daily, to keep Sreelakam as clean as possible.
